Overview

Currently Europeana.eu features content from 45 countries in 39 languages across more than 3,700 data providers. In total there are **52,134,737** objects available in Europeana.eu. Compared to February 2018, Europeana has **606,620 items more** in Europeana Collections. Several data partners have submitted new or updated metadata to Europeana in the last months, including *EUscreen*, *Swedish Open Cultural Heritage* and *Europeana Fashion*.

In line with Europeana Foundation's business plan and working towards its strategic plan 2015-2020, Europeana is working on improving the richness and the quality of the metadata present in the Europeana repository. This is being achieved by asking Europeana's partners to review the presence, quality and consistency of metadata fields, such as the description, title, date (created or issued), coverage (spatial or temporal). In addition to this Europeana is focusing on increasing the number of digital objects labelled with rights statements that enable re-use, and also on the provision of direct links to media files of high quality.

Important work completed by the Data Partner Services (DPS) team during the last three months include a proposal for a metadata component of the Europeana Publishing Framework, support of the Data Quality Committee actions, testing of the new data ingestion tool (Metis) as well as preparation of national workshops and conferences (Germany, Lithuania, Hungary, Bulgaria). In March, half of the DPS team contributed significantly to make the Aggregator Forum meeting that took place in the Berlin State Library a success, while in April, two colleagues from the Slovenian National Aggregator visited our office as part of the Aggregators in Residence initiative.


Europeana Publishing Framework

Improvement of data quality: we aim to increase the percentage of Tier 2+ material to at least 40% of the total and the percentage of Tier 3+ material to at least 20% of the total by end of 2018. Due to technical problems we are currently not able to extract the up to date numbers to report on the progress against the tiers of the Europeana Publishing Framework. After having cleaned up our database and moved to Metis over summer 2018, the technical problems should be solved to produce correct and reliable figures.

Content in Europeana by Country - Top 15


Looking at the country division of metadata throughout the digital objects available in Europeana.eu, the Netherlands, Norway, Germany, France, Spain, United Kingdom and Sweden provided the majority of the content. Countries contributing less than one per cent of the content are Estonia, United States Of America, Portugal, Lithuania, Romania, Latvia, Switzerland, Slovakia, Ireland, Bulgaria, Croatia, Luxembourg, Serbia, Malta, Cyprus, Russia, Israel, Iceland, Moldova, Turkey, Ukraine, Macedonia, Albania, Holy See (Vatican City State), Montenegro, Bosnia And Herzegovina.







